

Writing Out Numbers

Summary: Practice reading and writing numbers less than 100

Age Group: Grades Kindergarten through 2nd

Materials: Scrap paper and pencil, computer and printer (optional)

Instructions:

Have your child practice reading and writing numbers. Read each story problem with your child and have them read and write their answers when prompted.

1. Jimmy is a mechanic. He owns a lot of tools. In fact, he has seventy-eight tools in his tool box. Write out the number seventy-eight on a scrap piece of paper. Jimmy is currently working on his thirty first car this month. What number comes after thirty-one? What type of business might Jimmy work for?
2. Sandra is a pilot and today she flew to Alaska for the very first time. She has now visited forty-five states. Write out the number forty-five. Then write out all the numbers between forty-five and fifty. If you were a pilot, where would you want to fly?
3. Luke is a baker that likes to make cakes and cookies. Today, he has made one hundred eight cookies. Write the number one hundred eight. What are some of the tools that Luke would need to do his job?
4. Tina likes to make computer games. She spends hours every week working on her computer to make games. This week, she added it up and she has worked fifty-three hours. Write out the number fifty-three. What types of computer games would you make?

Extension: Download and print [Piggy Bank Savings](#) coloring sheet from Junior Achievement. For the activity, you will need to find a 6-sided die at home. You can check to see if you have one in a board game like Monopoly or Sorry. If you do not have one at home, you could even type “Roll a die” into Google and it can roll for you.

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
