Summary: Help your child determine which value is greater

Age Group: Grades Kindergarten through 2nd

Materials: A Hundreds chart (see below)

Instructions:

Help your child read the following story. Then help them with a few questions at the end. You can let your child use the Hundreds Chart on the next page if they need help.

Lisa, Aaron, and Josh were all friends on summer break. They all wanted to purchase a new video game that was recently released. The problem was, the new video game was \$60 and none of them had any money saved. Each of them decided to start a business in the summer to earn money to buy the video game. Lisa decided to become a pet sitter. Whenever people in her neighborhood went on vacation, she would feed and walk their pets. During the summer she earned \$72. Aaron helped his older brother with yard work. While his older brother cut the grass, Aaron would remove any weeds by hand. During the summer, Aaron earned \$87. Josh decided to sell lemonade to people in his neighborhood. His neighbors loved to have parties and Josh's lemonade was everyone's favorite. Josh earned \$94 during the summer with his business.
